Welcome to our first annual report!

As we kick off the new year, I want to thank you for your continued support for 1stGenYale. Since we started in April 2016, we have grown from an idea to connecting over 1,400 alumni and hundreds of students who share similar experiences being first generation in their families to attend any college or graduate school and also coming from low-income under-resourced backgrounds.

While contributing different life experiences, we celebrate diversity of all abilities, ages, cultures, genders, ethnicities, race, and thought and connect from all Yale schools, classes & years. We come together, support each other, and build new friendships in the Yale family.

Upon completing two years of creating 16 programs which connected alumni and students in different ways, we were recognized as an official Shared Interest Group of the Yale Alumni Association this past April. We are honored and humbled to have received the 2019 Excellence Award and the 2018 Outstanding SIG Award from the YAA Board of Governors.

Our Programs

We started from a pilot program with 25 alumni who came back to campus in late July to help 62 incoming first-year students navigate Yale & beyond. Next, we created a networking luncheon with 120 alumni and 400 students from 18 universities for the student-run 2017 1vyG Conference. Soon after, we added a pilot networking mixer in November, which was expanded from a multicultural mixer created by Magda Vergara '82 the prior year.

While we are a little bit beyond a start-up, alumni continue to raise their hand and create new pilot programs from global webinars and an online book group, picnics at the YAA Alumni Village, Central Park, Washington DC, and Yale Family

Weekend, to new chapters in New York and Washington DC, with Chicago coming soon!

Thank you to alumni volunteers who have initiated programs and attended our events with a special thanks to Barb Protacio '81, Aaron Shipp '96, and Michael Watson '81 for their work on our executive committee. A shout-out goes to Magda Vergara '82 for her engagement throughout our early years and continued support.

Since many of our programs are in partnership, a big thanks goes to faculty and staff from Yale College, Yale Summer Session, First-Year Scholars at Yale, The Community Initiative, and the Yale Alumni Association. Finally, a special thanks goes to President Peter Salovey, Secretary & Vice President for University Life Kim Goff-Crews, Dean of Undergraduate Admissions Jeremiah Quinlan, Yale College Dean Marvin Chun, YAA Executive Director Weili Cheng and Senior Director Nicholas Lewis for their continued support in building this new community within the Yale family.

Our Advocacy

We proudly advocate for those in the communities in which we serve. We nominate 1stGenYale alumni to volunteer leadership positions as At-Large Delegates and members of the YAA Board of Governors as well as for award recognition, such as the Yale Medal. We recommend our alumni for panels, such as Careers, Life, and Yale (CLY) A2S "Find Your Fit" in September 2019, our annual FSY July program, and the new Career Speaker Series, "Managing Change: Preparing FGLI Students for Future Leadership." In addition, we often promote our alumni and their work through our social media.


To encourage broad community participation, we are honored to co-sponsor events with university partners, such as the Yale School of Medicine's "De-Stigmatizing Disability: Tribulations and Triumphs of Disability at Yale" in October and webinars, such as CLY's "Gaining Power & Influences in the Workplace" in September or the Yale Club of Oregon & SW Washington's "Women in Health: Uncommon Paths" in March.

Throughout our events and later as mentors, alumni support first-gen students by sharing how they navigated Yale to later graduate work and careers. We were honored that students asked us to assist them with their program, "Being a Minority in STEM" in March and later asked our medical community alumni for advice on a "Pre-Med Guide for FGLI Students." We proudly have supported four Yale students who were granted Rhodes Scholarships since 2017 and many more who applied to graduate schools and first jobs.

January - Webinar








November Events

Other Ways to Support First-Gen Low-Income Students at Yale



Did you know:

- 20% of first-year Yale College students qualified for federal Pell Grants for low-income students (300+ qualified -- nearly double the number in the entering class six years ago).
- 17% of the Class of 2023 will be the first in their families to graduate from a four-year college -- a 75% increase in the class which matriculated in 2013.
- 1 out of 6 Yale College students self-identity as first-generation and/or low-income.
